Perry volunteers for the military when his dream of attending college falls through. He is sent to the front lines in Vietnam where he and his platoon come face to face with the real horror of warfare. He questions why black soldiers get the most dangerous assignments and why the U.S. is there at all.

The result is a society that constantly gets messages from the feed to buy, buy, buy. When Titus, the main character, meets Violet, his beliefs about the feed are challenged.

Fire

Junger, Sebastian 909.82 JUN 224

Danger junkies rejoice. Fire focuses on "people confronting situations that could easily destroy them." Raging forest fires in the Western U.S., war zones in Afghanistan, deadly diamond trade in Sierra Leone., travelers kidnapped by guerrilas in Kashmir, and the last whale harpooning in the Caribbean are just a few of the stories covered by Junge.

For Mike

Jeff's best friend, Mike, disappears. Did he die? Did he run away? Jeff begins to have dreams in which Mike say's "come to me". Jeff and his friend begin to chase after Mike through the clues he leaves in Mike's dreams.

Friday Night Lights: A Town, A Team, and a Dream

Bissinger, H.D. 796.332 BIS 8.0 366

The author spent the 1988 football season in Odessa, Texas, a town obsessed with it's champion high school football teamthe Permian Panthers. The book shows how single minded devotion to the team shapes the community and inspires, and sometimes shatters, the teenagers who wear the Panther's uniform.

Full Service

Weaver, Will FIC WEA 4.5 232

Sixteen year old Paul comes from a conservative Christian family and in the summer of 1965 he takes a job pumping gas in the town because his mom believes he needs to "meet the public". What an adventure meeting the public turns out to be. He learns about life and love as the country struggles through the Vietnam War.

Ghost Boy

Lawrence, Iain FIC LAW 4.4 326

Harold Kline is an albino--white from head to toe. His life is made unbearable by the other kids who call him names. Feeling like a freak already, he runs away and joins the circus. Can Harold stay true to the "freaks" who took him in and accepted him?

Going After Cacciato

O'Brien, Tim FIC OBR 4.6 301

A young soldier deserts his post in Vietnam, intent on walking the 8,000 miles to the peace talks in Paris. His remaining squad members are sent to find him and bring him back to the war and to reality.

If I Die in Combat Zone: Box Me Up and Ship Me Home

O'Brien, Tim 959.7043 OBR 205

The author gives us a personal account of his year as a foot soldier in Vietnam, with the ever-present danger of death and the human capacity to endure the endurable.

Into Thin Air: A Personal Account of the Mount Everest Disaster

Krakauer, Jon 792.522 KRA 8.9 293

Heroism and sacrifice triumph over foolishness, fatal error, and human frailty in this bone chilling narative of the authors ill-fated deadly climb of Mt. Everest.

Jarhead: A Marine's Chronicle of the Gulf War and Other Battles

Swofford, Anthony 956.704 7.4 260

The author, a U.S. Marine, recounts his disturbing experiences in the 1991 Gulf War and the emotional damage he suffered. He reflects on the nature of both the American military and the war itself.

Jonathan Strange and Mr. Norrell

Clark, S. FIC CLA 6.8 782

Magician, Mr. Norrell of Hurtfaw Abbey, uses his powers against Napoleon and the French in 1806 and is soon challenged by Jonathan Strange, a novice magician, who becomes obsessed with the Raven King, the twentieth century founder of English Magic.

The story follows two young Afghan boys, one wealthy, the other a servant's son. They are inseparable as children but when Amir betrays his friend Hussan, their relationship changes dramatically. It takes years for forgiveness to be earned.

Last Shot: A Final Four Mystery

Feinstein, John FIC FEI 4.8 251

Sports and mystery get equal play in this novel set duing the Final Four basketball tournament in New Orleans. Two aspiring journalists win a contest to cover the Final Four and along the way over hear a man trying to convince the star player of the Minnesota Sate Team to throw the championship game against Duke University.

Left for Dead: The USS Indianapolis and a Young Man's Search for Justice for the USS

Nelsen, Pete 940.54 NEL 8.3 186

When the USS Indianapolis was sunk at the end of World War II, her captain was blamed and court-martialed. Was it his fault? The survivors didn't think so and spent fifty years trying to clear his name. It took a student working on his History Day Project to clear his name.

Life of Pi

Martel, Yann FIC MAR 5.7 319

Pi Patel is the son of a zookeeper in India. The family makes the move to Canada by hitching a ride on an enormous freighter. After a shipwreck, Pi finds himself on a life boat with a zebra, a hyena, an orangutan, and a 450 lb. Bengal tiger. Pi uses his knowledge, wit, and faith to stay alive.

Lost in the Barrens

Mowat, Farley FIC MOW 6.6 192

Awasin and Jamie meet a challenge many mountain men could not endure. When their canoe is destroyed, they must face the wilderness with no food and no hope of rescue. Two lost huskies they tame bring companionship and maybe a way home from their dangerous adventure.

Monster

Myers, Walter Dean FIC MYE 5.1 281

Steve Harmon is accused of serving as the lookout for a robbery where the store owner is shot and killed. While in prison and the courtroom, Harmon records his experiences in the form of a movie screen play. He searches deep within his soul to prove to himself that he is not the "monster" the jury was told he was.

Never Cry Wolf

Mowat, Farley 599.74 MOW 8.9 164

Hordes of blood thirsty wolves are slaughtering the Arctic caribou and the government's Wildlife Service assigns Mowat to investigate. He is dropped alone onto the frozen tundra. As Mowat comes closer to the wolf world, he comes to believe the government is out to erase the wolf community.

Shane

Schaefer, Jack FIC SCH 5.5 151

Shane rode into a small Wyoming town in 1889, a time when homesteaders and cattlemen battled for territory and survival. He became a friend, a guardian, and a hero to the Starrett family.

Slap your Sides

Kerr, M.E. FIC KER 4.8 198

"They carried all the emotional baggage of men who might die...They carried shameful memories...They carried the common secret of cowardice...Men killed, and died, because they were embarrassed not to." Every story in this book speaks a truth that Tim O'Brien learned in Vietnam.

Jennings Burch's mother, too sick to care for him, drops him at an orphanage saying "I'll be right back." She never returned. Shuttled through a series of foster homes and institutions, Jennings finally gains the courage to reach out for love and finds it.
